10 Ways

To Help Your Child or Grandchild Grow in Faith

1. Create a Prayer Place in your child's bedroom.
2. Pray Grace Before and/or After Meals.
3. Make the Sign of the Cross when you pass a church.
4. Visit your family grave and pray for people who have died.
5. Place a holy water font at the front door and bless yourself as you leave the house (and keep it topped up with holy water, available free in the church).
6. Say Morning and/or Night Prayers.
7. Visit the church at a quiet time (open till 3.30.p.m. via parish office on weekdays) and chat to your child about what they see.
8. Read a story with your child and emphasise the Christian values found in it.
9. Do acts of kindness with your child.
10. Visit a religious site or a place that is religiously significant for your family.



Why?

1. Done with gentleness and creativity this can offer a quiet place for prayer, and also for sighs of anxiety or frustration, and can include supports like a holy book, picture or crucifix.
2. This reminds children to appreciate and to be thankful.
3. The Blessed Sacrament, the Body of Christ, consecrated by God with the help of the priest at Holy Mass, is present in the tabernacle in the church. Inside the church we also genuflect for the same reason.
4. This reminds us all that we pass through this life as pilgrims and that our deceased loved ones, having already done so, now enjoy a glorious, new everlasting life with the Lord.
5. This reminds us to be thankful to God for His many blessings and to ask Him to keep us safe from all evil or accident when we are out and about.
6. This reminds us that Jesus Christ is with us first and last each day and it helps us to be open to his gentle voice all day long.
7. We all need quiet time outs. Learning to be at ease inside a church can be very helpful for prayer and especially for whenever we have to face the inevitable hard times in life.
8. In a world where media often suggest that there is no real truth and that our comfort is all that has value, reading a good story with your child can show that we are 'called to greatness, not just to comfort' (*Pope Benedict XVI*) reinforcing children's idealism, altruism and appreciation of heroism.
9. We all learn best by 'doing' and to be real our Christian faith must be expressed in continuous acts of kindness, as much for our own sake as for the sake of those we may help, so our children can benefit from this both ways.
10. True religion is really about being conscious of our deep connectedness to God for whom 'our hearts are made.' These visits remind us that today peace, happiness, effectiveness and growth depend as much on our relationship with God as they did on the 'faith of our fathers' in the past.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Normally twice a month, one Sat. and one Sun. of each month at 12.30.p.m. – please check with Parish Office for exact dates. A Baptism Preparation Meeting will take place before the Baptism Ceremony, which both parents need to attend, in the Sacristy Meeting Room (*please enter by the Parish Office Door*). Attendance confirms the proposed date for the Baptism of a child. Non-attendance results in rearranging the Baptism date.

Please give **at least 4 weeks' notice** to the Parish Office.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: You will need to contact the Priest of your **Parish of Residence** (*where you are presently living*) at the same time you are booking the Church and Reception Venue for your Marriage, or at least six months before the wedding date, to begin completing the Pre-Nuptial Enquiry. This is irrespective of what Church will be the wedding venue. Independently you also need to contact the Civil Registrar of Marriages.

Marriage Preparation Course: It is essential that you do a Marriage Preparation Course. Booking a Marriage Preparation Course should happen at the same time as booking the Church for your Wedding Day. We at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, Parish of Firhouse, recommend:

To Share in Mass/Easter Ceremonies by Smartphone.

To set up an app on your smart phone or tablet (or computer or laptop) giving instant access to live streaming of normally public events like Holy Mass from the Firhouse Parish Church without having to go through Google and/or the parish website you can do the following:

1. Google Firhouse Parish, select it and click on "Website" (or go to www.firhouseparish.ie).
2. From the parish website Home page click on "Watch Mass Live" (this may take more than one attempt). This transfers you to "MCNmedia.tv," the live streaming company.
3. Click on the three small parallel lines on the upper right of your screen and you will be offered options.
4. Click on the "Add Page To" option and you will be offered further options.
5. Click on "Home Screen" option for your phone (for a computer or laptop you would click on "Bookmarks").
6. You will be offered a long title. Delete all but the last word - "Firhouse" and add the word "Church."
7. Click on "Add." The task is now completed.

When you back out of everything and return to your phone's Home screen the app will be among your other apps, a small grey square with "Firhouse Church" written below it (on a computer or laptop it will appear, probably at the bottom, on your list of bookmarks). Click on it when there is live streaming of Mass or other public events and you'll get straight in. If nothing is being streamed at the time, you'll be told that.

Given the restricted access to our church due to the Covid 19 coronavirus pandemic, please share this information by phone as widely as you can with other parishioners.
