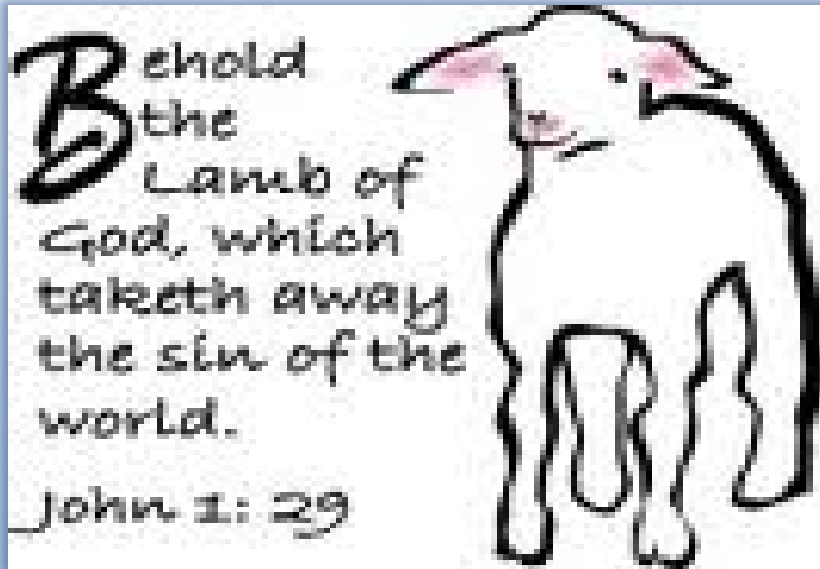


Getting Ready for Sunday!

Ordinary Time

- The Season of Christmas ends with the Feast Day of the Baptism of the Lord which always occurs on the Sunday after the Feast of the Epiphany on 6 January.
- As with our lives in general, all time cannot be highpoints of celebration; otherwise we would not appreciate the difference.
- In our lives we grow through our everyday and ordinary experiences to grow each year from birthday to birthday.
- In church time the season of ordinary time is a time of growth in all aspects of our lives, our families, our parish community – all as part of our belonging with and in God – as people given a great purpose in life as we build the kingdom of love right where we are.
- The colour marking this season of growth is GREEN – the natural colour of growth and new life!

Liturgical Colour for Ordinary Time



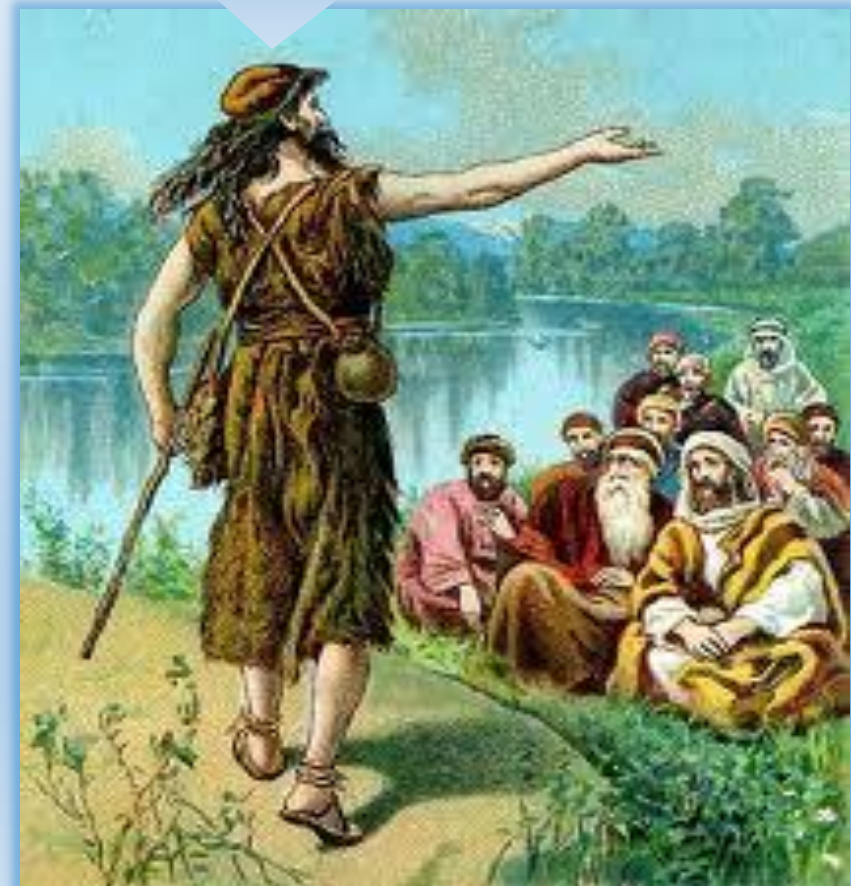
The next day John the Baptist saw Jesus coming towards him and declared,

“Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, “After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.””

Jesus does not use animals for sacrifice in order to bring about what is great.

Jesus sacrifices Himself!

If we follow Jesus we must be willing to sacrifice our time, our energy, our talents, etc. for the good of all – just like Jesus does!



I myself did not know him; but I came baptising with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.



And John testified, 'I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him.'



I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptise with water said to me, “He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptises with the Holy Spirit.”

God speaks to our hearts through the Spirit in our hearts, letting us know what is right and how to be truly the best we can.
