## John 4:5-42



Jesus Meets the Samaritan Woman at the Well.

Jesus meets the woman at the well at Sychar. It was at this well that Jacob drew water many centuries before this.

The woman doesn't expect this man, unknown to her, to speak to her. However, Jesus never loses an opportunity to speak to anyone.

She has not lived her life well according to Jewish law, but Jesus has no concern about this. Jesus is present for all of us regardless of what we have done in our past. Jesus offers us His love so that we have the courage to grow and change as we try to become our best selves.

The woman chose to follow the way of Jesus no matter what it cost her. She knew that what is of God lasts forever, not like the things and food that we use each day.

If you are open to seeing God in ordinary places, people and experiences you will find Him – or He will find you!

So he came to a Samaritan city called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey, was sitting by the well.

It was about noon. A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her:

Give me a drink.



(His disciples had gone to the city to buy food.)

Jesus gives time to all!  
It doesn't matter what  
anyone has done or who they  
are: Jesus is there with and  
for each person.

How is it that you, a Jew, ask a  
drink of me, a woman of  
Samaria?

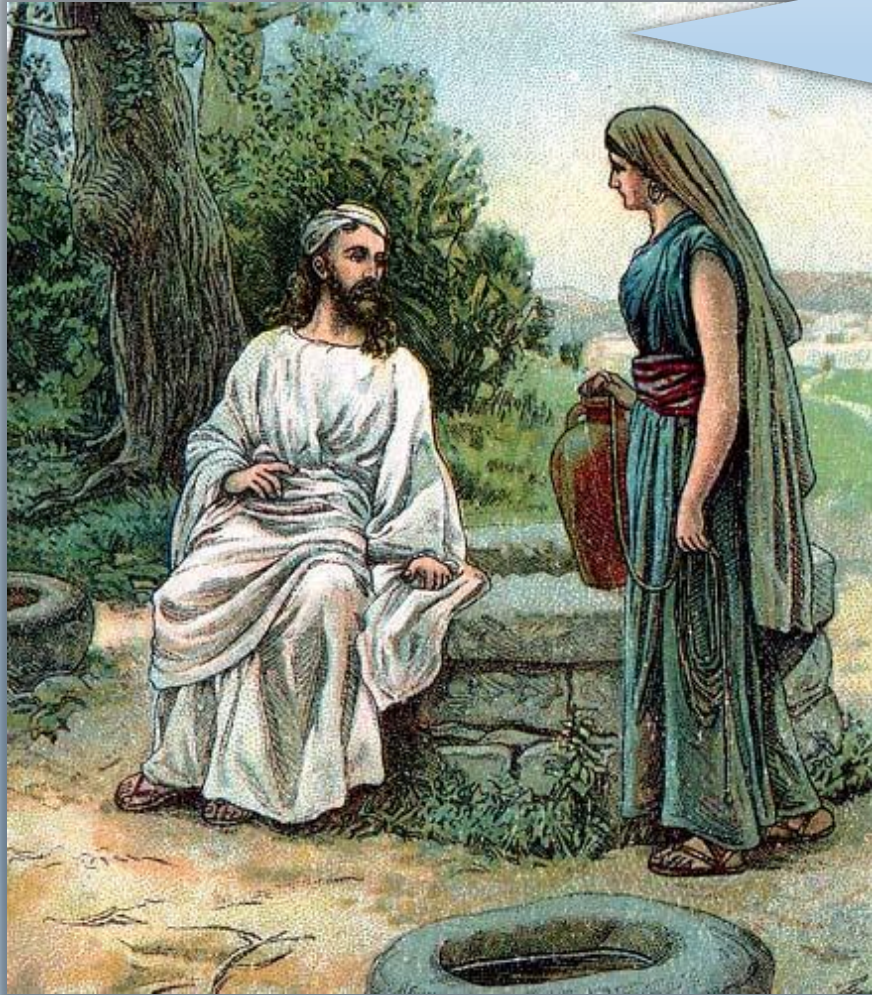
Jews do not share  
things in  
common with  
Samaritans.

If you knew the gift of  
God, and who it is that is  
saying to you, "Give me a  
drink", you would have  
asked him, and he would  
have given you living water.





Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us the well and with his sons and his flocks drank from it?



Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.

Everything in the world,  
including water, runs out!  
God's love and power lasts  
for all time.  
God cares for us at all times  
and in all places.





God knows everything  
that is in our hearts  
and minds! Nothing is  
hidden from God. He  
loves us at all times.  
God never abandons us!

Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be  
thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw  
water.

Go, call your husband, and  
you have had five husbands,  
and the one you have now is  
not your husband. What  
you have said is true!





Sir, I see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshipped on this mountain, but you say that the place where people must worship is in Jerusalem.



Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews.

But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.



I know that Messiah is coming. When he comes, he will  
proclaim all things to us.



I am he, the one who is  
speaking to you.

The woman met Jesus in  
a very ordinary place  
and she believed it was  
God!

We meet Jesus in  
everyone we meet!

Where have you seen  
Jesus today?



Just then his disciples came. They were astonished that he was speaking with a woman, but no one said, ‘What do you want?’ or, ‘Why are you speaking with her?’ Then the woman left her water-jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, ‘Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?’

This woman was a person that Jews normally would not speak with! The disciples were not surprised that Jesus was talking to her, because they knew that He gave Himself to all people no matter where they were from or who they are.





They left the city and were on their way to him. Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, ‘Rabbi, eat something.’ But he said to them, ‘I have food to eat that you do not have,’ ‘My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to complete his work. Do you not say,



“Four months more, then comes the harvest”? But I tell you, look around you, and see how the fields are ripe for harvesting. The reaper is already receiving wages and is gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. For here the saying holds true, “One sows and another reaps.”

I sent you to reap that for which you did not labour.  
Others have laboured, and you have entered into their  
labour.’





Many Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the woman's testimony, 'He told me everything I have ever done.' So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them; and he stayed there for two days. And many more believed because of his word.

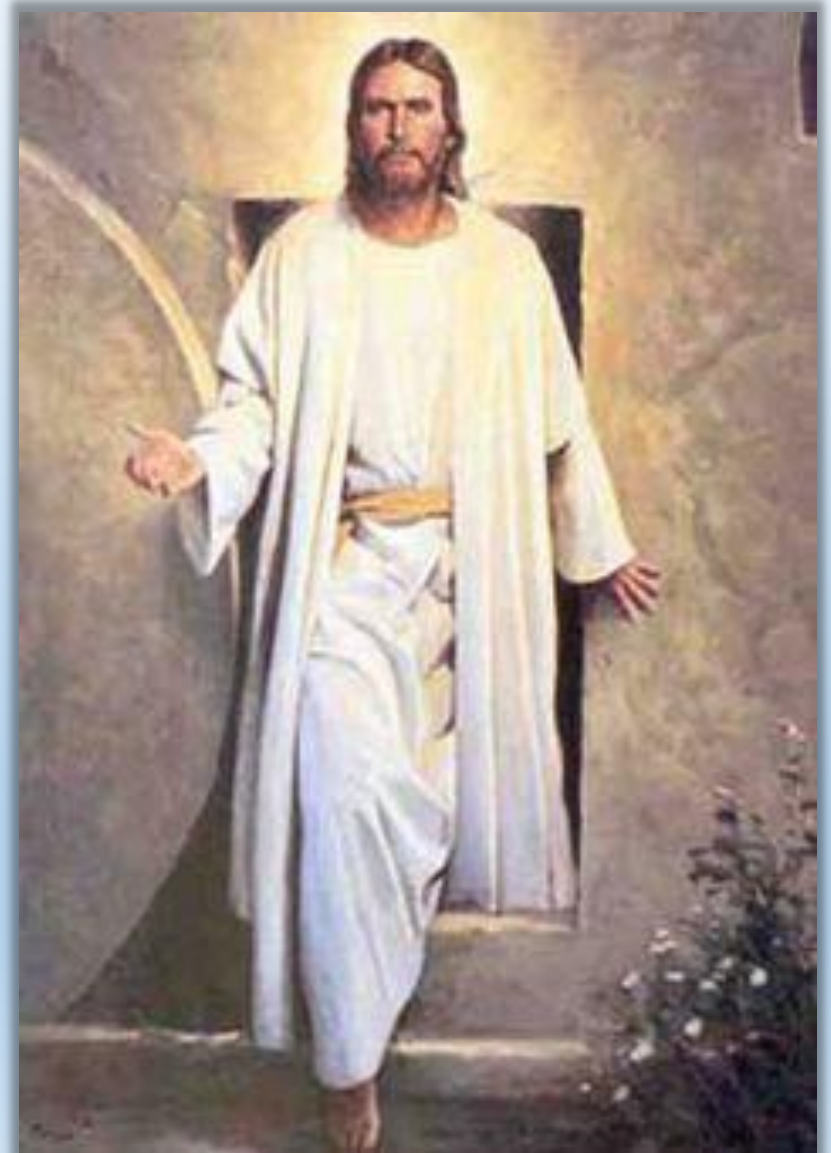
The woman told her friends all that she knew of Jesus and they also chose to follow Him!
