# The Feast of Pentecost



# Signs and symbols of Pentecost :

The Paschal Candle is beside the Baptism Font now as a sign that we receive the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation.



The celebrant will be wearing red today representing the flames which came down on the heads of the disciples as they waited in fear for Jesus to fulfil His promise to send the Spirit.

This Sunday we celebrate Feast of Pentecost.

This is the last day of the Easter Season!

This is the day on which the disciples received the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, one of which was courage, so that they could go out and proclaim the message of Jesus without being overcome by fear.

We too, as Baptised members of Christ's Body have been given the same gifts to tell others of Jesus and to live as He did in the Gospels.

When we use the Gifts of the Holy Spirit we then produce the fruits of love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

As today is a very special day in our church calendar, the first reading and the Gospel story are in this presentation.

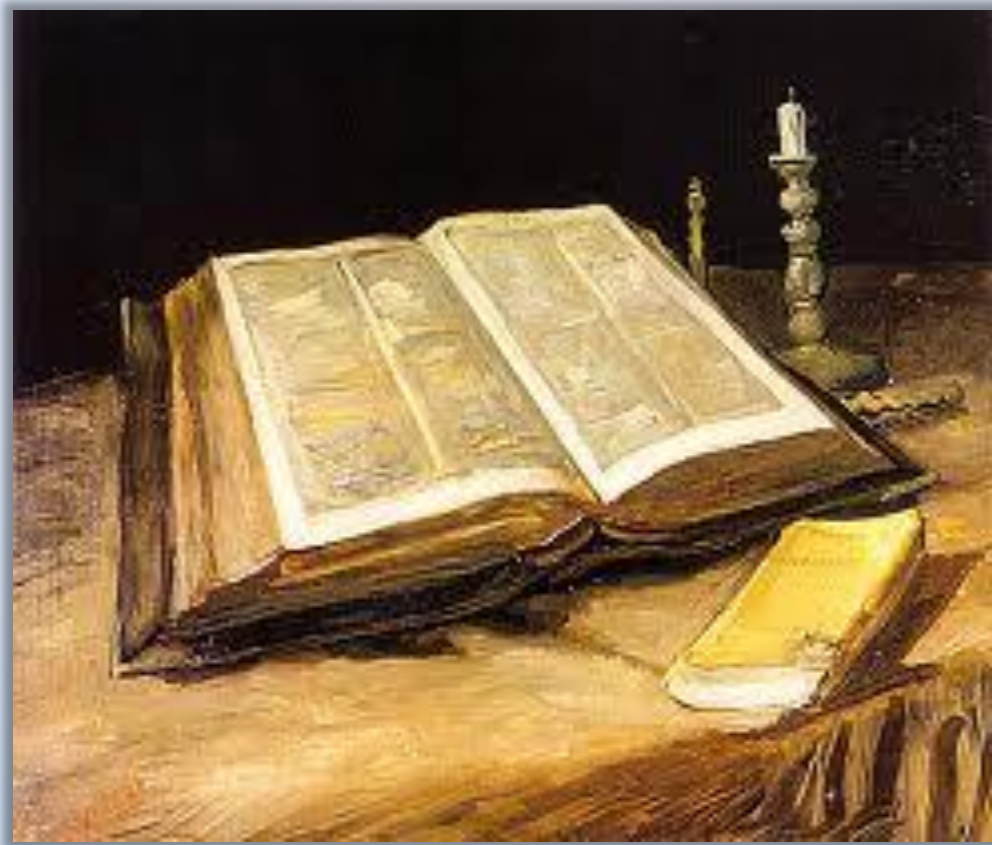
The first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles and tells us about the coming of the Holy Spirit on the disciples.

The Gospel gives an account of Jesus' telling the disciples that He would give them the power of the Holy Spirit so that they could continue His mission of healing and sharing the Good News.

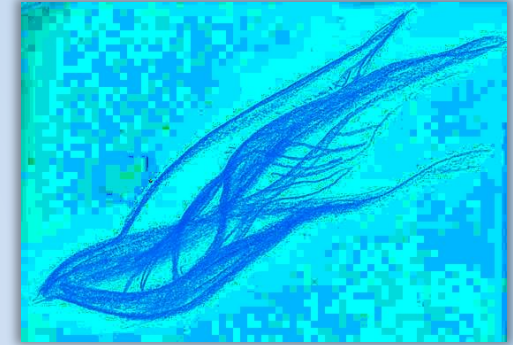
The Acts of the Apostles were written by St Luke and may be found in the Bible just after the Gospels.



# Acts 2:1-11



When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.



They were  
afraid and  
lonely  
without  
Jesus!



Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.





Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked:

Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?





And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.

# John 20:19-23



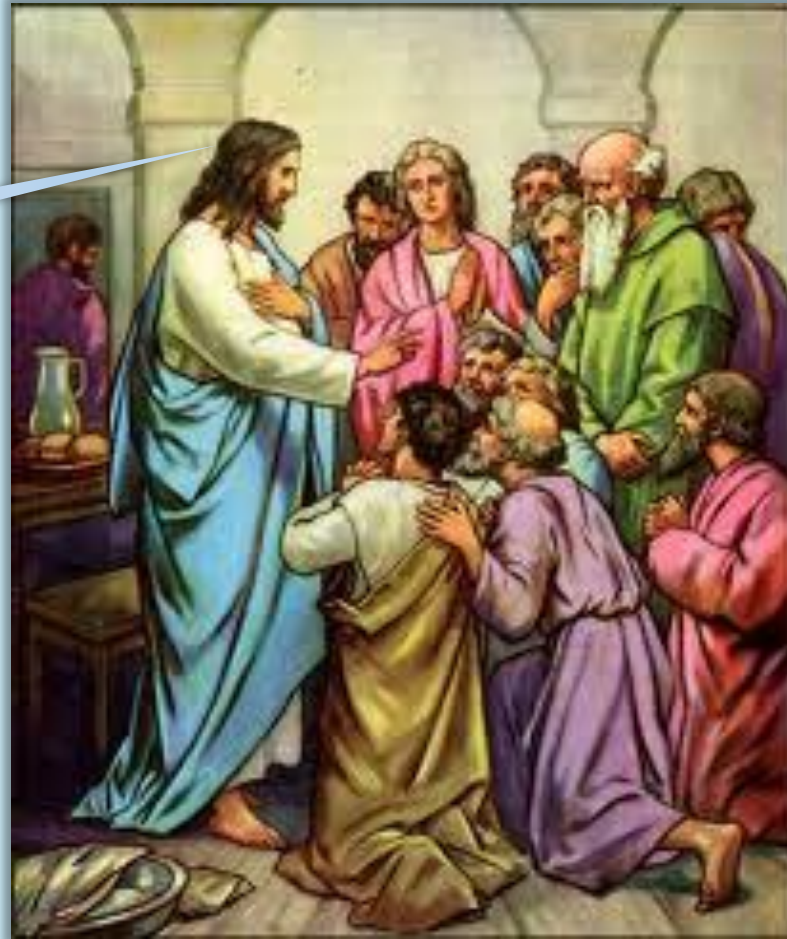


When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews

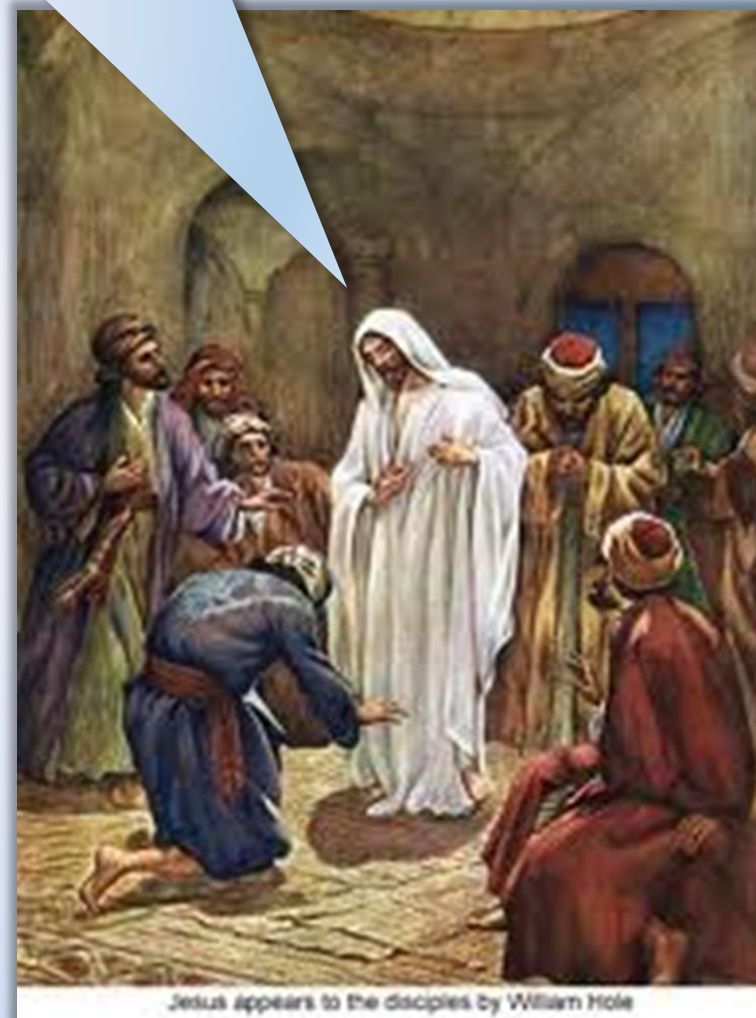

good!

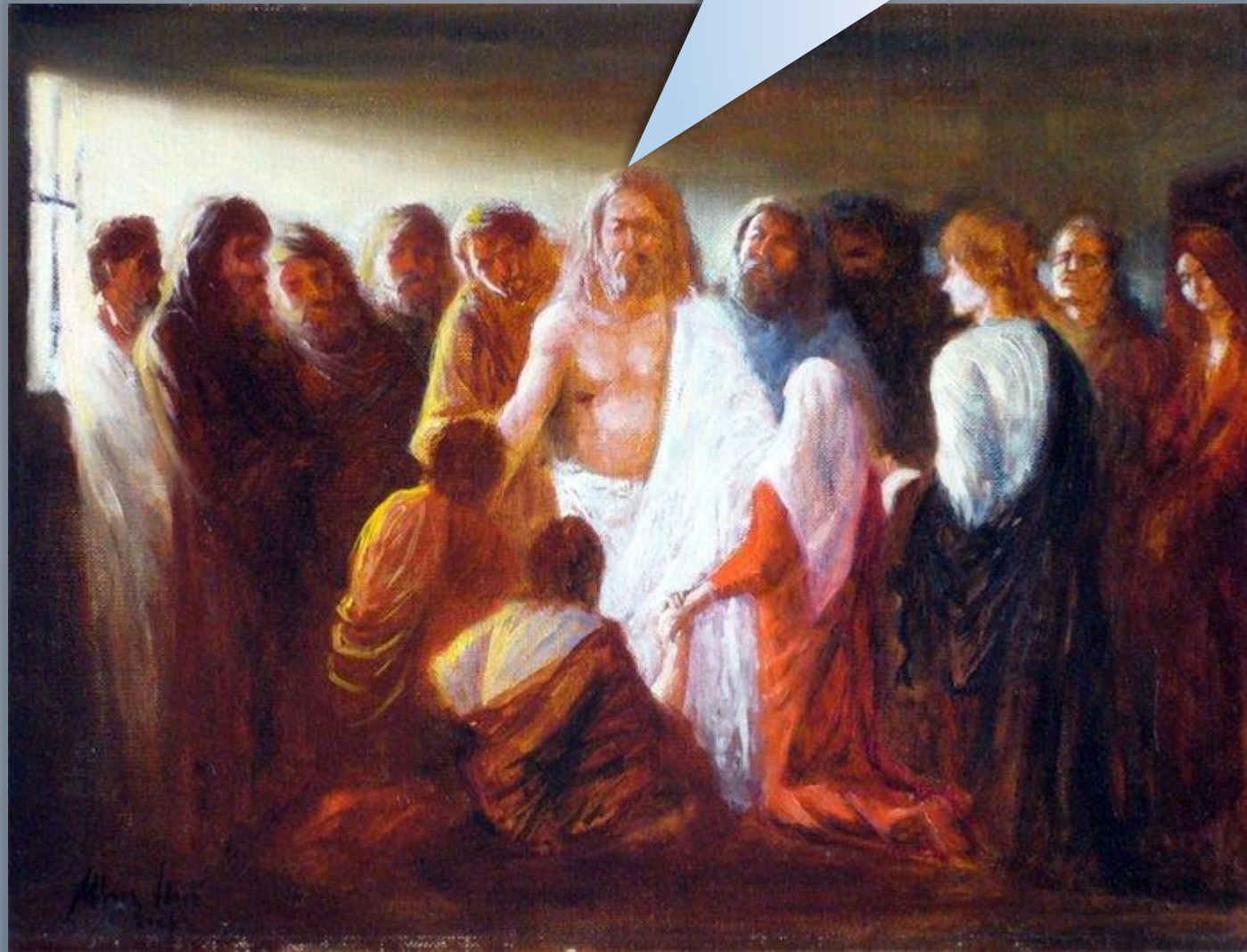
He came to show us the
