The Gospel encourages us to treat others with justice, fairness, truthfulness, respect and love.

We are all connected to God as members of Christ's Body.

When we hurt any one person, it effects all other members of Christ's Body.

If two people have an argument, it is in everyone's interest to help them to agree on doing whatever is right.

Sometimes it is difficult to admit failure to be loving!

Matthew 18:15-20



Helping another person to become more like Jesus.

Jesus said to his disciples:

If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother.



Reflection: Do you need to say SORRY to anyone today?

If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you:
the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge



Reflection:

Sometimes you may need help from someone else before you can sort out your differences!

Ask for help when you need it

But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

Reflection: Ask for even more help if you can still not agree on what is right.



I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.



Reflection:

Every loving and selfish deed is
connected with God.

Every selfish deed breaks our link
with God.



I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.
