


The Widow's Mite

Mark 12:38-44


As he taught, he said:

Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the market-places, and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honour at banquets!






They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation.




They like to look important, but have no regard for the importance of others!

He sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums.








Then he called his disciples and said to them:


Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury.
