# **Parish Bulletin**

Sunday 12th January 2025 - The Baptism of Our Lord



And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son the Beloved, my favour rests on you.'

The Baptism of the Lord is the great event celebrated by the Eastern churches on the feast of Epiphany because it is the occasion of the first public revelation of all the Three Persons in the Holy Trinity, and the official revelation of Jesus as the Son of God to the world by God the Father. Hence, it is described by all four Gospels. It marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

The turning point: His baptism by John was a very important event in the life of Jesus.

First it was a moment of identification with us sinners. Sinless, Jesus received the baptism of repentance to identify himself with his people who realized for the first time that they were sinners.

Second, it was a moment of God's affirmation of His identity and mission: that He is the Son of God and His mission is to preach the Good News of God's love and salvation and to atone for our sins by becoming the "suffering servant."

Third, it was a moment of equipment. The Holy Spirit equipped Jesus by descending on him in the form of dove, giving him the power of preaching and healing.

Fourth, it was a moment of decision to begin public ministry at the most opportune time after receiving the approval of his Heavenly Father as His beloved Son. (fronyshomilies.com)



### WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 2025 - 18 JAN - 25 JAN



The theme of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 is based on a text from the Gospel of John: "Do you believe this?" (John 11:26). The prayers and reflections have been prepared by the brothers and sisters of the monastic community of Bose in northern Italy.

The year 2025 will mark the 1,700th anniversary of the First Ecumenical Council. This commemoration provides a unique opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians as expressed in the Creed formulated at that Council. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 is an invitation to draw on this common heritage and to enter more deeply into the faith that unites all Christians.

# **JUBILEE YEAR 2025**



The Jubilee Year 2025, on the theme Pilgrims of Hope, officially commenced on Christmas Eve with the rite of Opening of the Holy Door of the Papal Basilica of Saint Peter by Pope Francis. A Jubilee Year is celebrated every twenty-five years by the worldwide Church during which Catholics come together to rejoice in the faith. Over the Jubilee Year, we are encouraged to show mercy, forgive past wrongs, relieve debt, to spiritually rejuvenate, and be offered an opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence. On 29 December,

across the island, bishops celebrated Mass to mark the launch of this Holy Year. Archbishop Dermot Farrell celebrated Mass in Saint Mary's Pro-Cathedral, Archdiocese of Dublin.

In his homily Archbishop Farrell said, "During the upcoming Jubilee Year you are invited to journey the pilgrim path of the four churches in the inner city - Saint Andrew's Church on Westland Row, City Quay, Sean McDermott Street, Saint Mary's Pro-Cathedral - and Saint Kevin's Church, Glendalough. [These are to be] called 'Pockets of Hope'.
