

ANYONE WHO DOES NOT CARRY THE CROSS AND FOLLOW ME CANNOT BE MY DISCIPLE

The **first reading**, taken from the Book of Wisdom, instructs us to ask for the gifts of discernment and strength from the Holy Spirit so that we may do the will of God as His true disciples.

The **Responsorial Psalm** (Ps 90), instructs true disciples to lead holy lives by remaining constantly aware of the brevity and uncertainty of life.

The **second reading**, taken from St. Paul's letter to Philemon, teaches us that detachment and renunciation are necessary for a true disciple of Christ. As a responsible Apostle and zealous disciple of Christ, Paul had to renounce the service of his new helper, Onesimus, and return him to his master. As a new disciple of Christ, Onesimus had to leave Paul, face his owner as a runaway slave, and accept the consequences.

Today's **Gospel** reminds us to count the cost of being a disciple and follower of Christ because the cost is high: true Christian discipleship requires one to "renounce" both earthly possessions and possessions of the heart (i.e., one's relationships). Using the two parables of the tower-builder and the king defending his country, Jesus says we must think long and hard about Christian discipleship before we commit ourselves to Jesus in this full, life-long surrender. TWO NEW YOUNG SAINTS – AN INSPIRATION FOR YOUNG PEOPLE – A NEW GENERATION OF SAINTS

This Sunday September 7th Pope Leo XIV will canonize Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati, two young men who herald a new generation of saints and give us all hope in this Jubilee Year of Hope.



CARLO ACUTIS, born in London in 1991 and raised in Milan, embraced a deep love for the Eucharist from an early age. "To always be united to Jesus: This is my life plan," he once told his mother after receiving his First Communion. Carlo was not only devoted to daily Mass and acts of kindness—he was also a tech-savvy teenager who used his digital skills to evangelize. His Eucharistic Miracles website, which catalogued over 100 documented cases of Eucharistic phenomena, has since travelled to thousands of parishes worldwide.

Two miracles have been approved as signs of Carlo's intercession.

"People who place themselves before the sun get a tan; people who place themselves before the Eucharist become saints," he once said—a quote that continues to resonate with Catholic youth. (I am with you, a documentary on Carlo Acutis is available on You Tube – EWTN)

PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI, born in 1901 in Turin, Italy, and beatified in 1990 by Pope John Paul II, Frassati was a mountaineer, student, and tireless servant of the poor. His motto, Verso l'Alto—"to the heights"—reflects both his love of mountain climbing and his spiritual aspiration toward heaven.
