Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.

Naaman, the Syrian military commander in the **first reading**, was an outcast, not only because of his leprosy, but because he was also a non -Israelite, a pagan. But he returned to thank the Prophet Elisha for curing his

leprosy, and as a sign of his gratitude, transferred his allegiance to the God of Israel.

St. Paul, in the second reading, advises Timothy to be grateful to God even in his physical sufferings and amid the dangers associated with spreading the Word of God because God will always be faithful to His people. Today's Gospel story tells us of a single non-Jewish leper (a "Samaritan, considered by the Jews as heretic"), who returned to thank Jesus for healing him, while the nine Jewish lepers went their way. Perhaps, they were under the false impression that healing was their right as God's "chosen people." So, they hurried off to obtain health certificates from the priests. "Where are the other nine?" Jesus asked the returned Samaritan and the crowd rhetorically. Today's readings also remind us that Faith and healing go hand in hand (frtonyshomilies.com)

LOURDES 2025 – A Thank You to All

As a young girl St Bernadette, frail and suffering from asthma, lived with her family in a small suffocating dwelling. Then on 11th Feb 1858, Our Lady, dressed in white appeared before her from a cliff over a nearby dump. She smiled upon Bernadette, and conversed with her. This surprised her. It was the first of 18 apparitions. Ever since up to 6 million pilgrims are drawn here each year. What had been a dump has become a centre of healing, mercy and peace.

Lourdes has always held a special place for me. I was then delighted to be there from 24th to 29th Sept with thirty people from our parishes. Many features made this memorable for us. We loved an early morning mass at the Grotto; walked in the Candlelight Processions; the Stations of the Cross, etc. we washed in the water from the spring that first gushed forth during one of the apparitions.

The sick are at the centre of Lourdes, and are blessed during a large daily procession. They draw out the best in those who help. Young helpers are especially evident. We prayed for the people we knew. We lit a very large candle for all parishioners. We chatted, we laughed a lot.

"I do not promise to make you happy in this life but in the other", Mary said to Bernadette. In this, she invited her to find her happiness in the 'other' world, where one is aware of God's love for them, and where people seek to share His love with all. A message worth remembering for us today.

A big thank you to all who were part of a memorable venture, and to all who made it possible.


