First Sunday of Advent

In the **first reading (Is 2:1-5)**, Isaiah describes his prophetic vision of all nations making a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, affirming their Faith in the one true God.

Today's **Responsorial Psalm (Ps 122**), is a joyous hymn originally sung as pilgrims journeyed up to the Temple in Jerusalem. They prepare us for our yearly pilgrimage.

In the **second reading (Rom 13:11-14)**, Paul exhorts the Roman Christian community to get ready to meet Jesus in his *Second Coming* by discharging their duties properly and by freeing themselves from their former pagan tendencies toward excessive drinking, sexual promiscuity, jealousy, and rivalry. We, too, are challenged to make spiritual preparations for Christ's birth in our lives.

In today's **Gospel (Mt 24:37-44)**, Jesus warns us of the urgency of vigilant preparation on our part that we may meet him as our Judge both at the end of our lives on earth and on the day of the Last Judgment when he comes in his glory. Jesus reminds us that the unrepentant and ill-prepared evil people were destroyed by the flood in the time of Noah and that a thief would break in and plunder the precious belongings of an ill-prepared house owner. Using additional examples later, Jesus repeats his warning for us to be vigilant and well-prepared all the time, doing the will of God by loving Him in Himself and in everyone else. We sincerely thank all of our parishioners who contribute regularly to the Planned Giving / Family Offering in the Parish either by standing order or weekly envelope. If you haven't contributed to date, and are now in a position to consider doing so, we would greatly appreciate your support. These contributions are the only source of income which stay in the parish for the day to day running and upkeep of our Churches, as the collections taken up during masses go directly to the Diocese.

As you may be aware, a tax scheme exists whereby those who contribute €250 or more to a charity in a given tax year (approx. €4.81 per week or €21 per month) can claim an additional sum from the Revenue Commissioners which is sent directly to the charity concerned. As the parish has the status of a charity, any donation given to the parish of Bohernabreena Parish is classed as a charitable donation which means that we are eligible to claim this additional income for the upkeep of the parish. In being part of this tax scheme, no loss or cost will be incurred by you as taxpayer, and confidentiality will be assured in all aspects of this process. All that is required is that you complete an 'Enduring Certificate' form, available from the parish office, and then the parish makes the claim directly to the Revenue Commissioners.

The extra revenue that is received will be used directly for the upkeep and day to day running costs of the Parish. This revenue is quite substantial, e.g. for a contribution of exactly €250 in the tax year the Church will receive an additional €112.33 directly from the Revenue Commissioners, thus making your donation worth €362.33 to the parish. If a donation is greater, returns to parish increase accordingly.

WEEKEND MASS COLLECTIONS

The weekly PLANNED GIVING ENVELOPES or STANDING ORDERS are the SOLE SOURCES OF INCOME which remain in the parish, contributing to the day to day running of the parish - altar expenses, light & heat, wages, etc. Every contribution is important to us, no matter how much or how little you can give. If you are in a position to contribute to the planned giving, please contact our parish offices for a box of envelopes or standing order form. In order to keep banking costs to a minimum, standing orders are our preferred method of payment please.
